Cancer Care for our Veterans



When it comes to cancer care, our team is committed to arming the Veterans in our community with the best possible information about their disease and access to the most advanced and effective treatment options available.

The Veterans Administration created the Veteran Community Care program to provide care to Veterans through community providers when the VA cannot provide the care needed. With Community Care, eligible Veterans have access to a network of more than a million community providers across all 50 states and U.S. territories.

As a Veteran, you may be eligible for Community Care if you meet any of the following six criteria:

- You require a specific service your VA health facility does not provide
- You live in a state or territory that doesn't have a full-service VA healthcare facility
- You previously qualified under the 40-mile distance requirement and remained qualified on June 6, 2018, and you still live in a location that would make you eligible under these requirements
- VA can't provide the care you need within our access standards for drive and wait times
- You and your VA provider agree that getting care from an in-network community provider is in your best medical interest
- VA can't provide the service needed in a way that meets our quality standards
